## Importing PubMed citations into an EndNote library

For better results, we recommend searching for citations in PubMed, then importing them to EndNote. This guide will help you with the few easy steps to import PubMed citations.

Once you have completed your search in PubMed, you must save the references to your computer before you import them into EndNote X. To properly save PubMed citations:

- Change the 'Display' to **MEDLINE**
- Next, select **Send to 'File'**



When your browser prompts you, be sure to **'Save to disk.'** You can name the file anything you like and save the file anywhere on your computer, just be sure you remember the name and where you saved the file.

Now, switch back to your **EndNote X** window. Make sure your library is open.

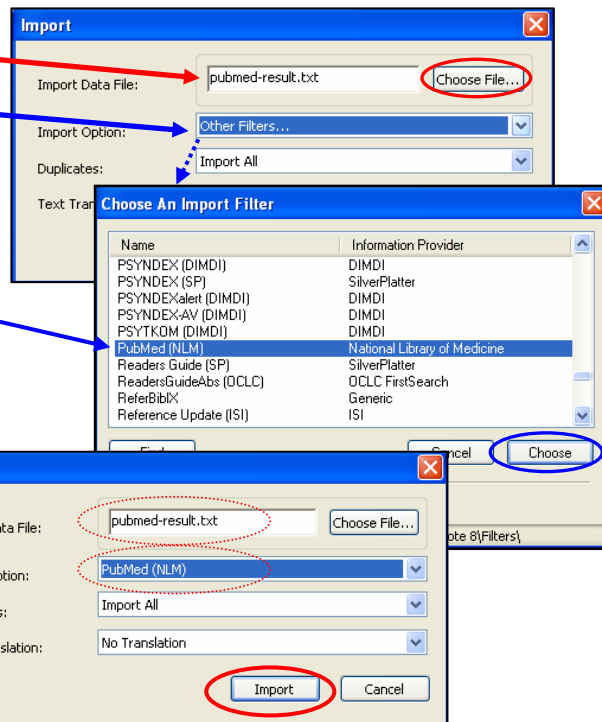
To Import References:

- Select **'Import'** from the **'File'** menu on the tool bar; or
- Click on the **'Import'** icon



Once you choose to import references, an 'Import window' will appear. There are several steps before the references can be properly imported:

- Select your saved PubMed results using **'Choose File'**
- For 'Import Options' select **'Other Filters'** then wait for the menu window to load
- Scroll down the alphabetical list of import filters and select **'PubMed(NLM)'**
- Click **'Choose'**



Now your 'import window' will have the proper file in the Import Data File box, and 'Pubmed (NLM)' in the Import Option box. You can to eliminate duplicates upon importing or later. PubMed needs No text Translation. All that is left is to click **'Import.'** Your references will be imported into your EndNote library.

Once your file has completed uploading, the references will be added to your EndNote library.
