## **Extramammary Paget's Disease**



THIS ULCERATED PLAQUE had been present in the perianal area for several years. In its early stages, extramammary Paget's disease can be mistaken for psoriasis, intertrigo, or fungal infection. This tumor is locally invasive and has potential for metastasis. It occasionally arises in association with an adenocarcinoma of underlying secretory glands or may be associated with a primary adenocarcinoma of the rectum, urethra, or cervix.
