single degree, \$21,000 for dual degree.

Postdoctoral:
NIH will pay (of the combined tuition,
fees) 60% of the total, up to \$4,500,
\$16,000 for formal degree

Institutional Allowance(s) / Indirect Costs:

insurance, lab supplies, travel, etc.):

Direct Compensation:

\$29,000 for grants with a start date before

\$32,500 for grants with start date on or after
7/1/2011

Health Insurance:

Single - \$4,166/yr, effective 7/1/2011
(Single + 1 and Family are no longer covered)

Tuition:

To be determined based on available funds
after deducting the stipend and the health
benefits. Any tuition charges that push the total
(stipend + health insurance + tuition) beyond
\$38,496 will be waived for students that are on
research project grants.
