Mount Sinai Queens is a 228-bed facility founded in 1892. It became the first community hospital to bear the Mount Sinai name and is the only hospital in the borough of Queens to be designated as a Primary Stroke Center certified by The Joint Commission and New York State Department of Health. We have a new state-of-the-art Emergency Department thanks to our recent expansion project and offer services such as orthopedics, pediatric, cardiac surgery, cancer, endocrinology, and more.

Mount Sinai Queens is easily accessible by car, subway, or bus. Take the N or W subway lines or the Q18 or Q102 bus. Parking, for a fee, is located on 30th Road between Crescent Street and 23rd Street.

*The Pharmacy Department at Mount Sinai Queens provides patient-centered care in infectious diseases, emergency medicine, cardiology, critical care, internal medicine, oncology, surgical specialties, neurology, pediatrics, infusion services, and more.*

The pharmacy follows a centralized model with staff pharmacists and certified pharmacy technicians dedicated to verifying, compounding and dispensing medications; and a decentralized model composed of clinical pharmacists dedicated to bedside care. Our Hazardous and Non-Hazardous Cleanrooms are USP 797 compliant for standard infusions and chemotherapy preparations. Residents will have the opportunity to staff, prepare infusions, and serve as drug-information resources and as manager's on-call.

The pharmacy maintains a relationship with various colleges of pharmacy, including a formal relationship with Long Island University through which the resident may earn a teaching certificate.

### General Residency

The PGY-1 Pharmacy Residency Program at Mount Sinai Queens is ASHP Accredited and accepts two (2) full-time PGY-1 residents each year.

#### How to Apply:

Applications to the program must be submitted through [PhORCAS](#) by **January 5th**

#### Required Documentation:

1. Letter of intent
2. Three letters of recommendation
  - a. At least one (1) professional
  - b. At least one (1) academic
3. All post-secondary transcripts, including:
  - a. Pharmacy school
  - b. Pre-pharmacy course work
  - c. Prior degrees
4. A professional, clinically relevant writing sample is required to be submitted through PhORCAS
  - a. Acceptable examples: Newsletter articles, Drug Monograph, Treatment Plan, Drug Information Questions and Answer, Research Protocols
  - b. Unacceptable examples: Journal Clubs, Outlines, Power Point Presentations, Non-Pharmacy Related Material

5. Applicants must be eligible for NYS licensure and must obtain a NYS pharmacy intern permit until licensure is received
6. Licensure must be obtained by November 1st
