



The applications should: 1) lead to the development of new technologies, 2) adapt existing innovative technologies, devices, and/or electronic systems, 3) repurpose existing devices and electronic systems, or 4) conduct testing of single or combined components of an integrated, long-term, automated, wearable stimulation device or electronic system to monitor or enhance the mechanistic processes or functional outcomes of MBIs. For the purposes of this NOSI, MBIs are nonpharmacologic approaches that include mind/brain focused interventions (e.g., meditation, mindfulness, hypnosis, art/music) or combined mind and body treatment (e.g., acupuncture, massage, spinal manipulation/mobilization) or meditative


